- Training our leaders and teams to respond to the movement of the Spirit in the Sunday services.







Caring Deeply

Loving Each Other as we Live Togeher

The purpose of caring deeply is accomplished most effectively as the whole body of the church ministers to the needs of those within the church and outside of our church community. The majority of caring deeply takes place through the fellowship of community groups, sunday school classes, and relationships within the life of our church family. In addition, the Shepherdesses, the Deacon's Mercy Team, our Prayer Team, and Our Father's Storehouse provide care and support to those in need. Wildwood has responded to those in need and has sought diligently to meet spiritual, emotional, and physical needs. We seek to come alongside individuals and families during their times of illness, loss, and ongoing health or personal issues. Many have been comforted and expressed thanks for the prayers, cards, visits, calls, and encouragement given to them.

2022-2023 Highlights

- Visits have been made to members in their homes, hospital rooms, rehab facilities, and assisted living apartments.
- Pastoral visits and Communion have been given to those unable to attend Sunday services as well as those nearing the end of life.
- Counseling has been provided for those dealing with difficult circumstances.
 Funerals have been arranged and conducted at Wildwood Church, chapels, and grave sides.
- Handwritten notes/cards were sent to many to encourage and remind them that they matter to God and matter to us.
- Every week, our team prays for those in need. Phone calls are also made to support and care for many who have dealt with difficult life issues.
- We held a Thank you Luncheon to honor Wildwood's caregivers. Curt Cloninger from Perimeter Church was our special speaker.

- We hope to continue to hear stories of compassion and help for others in the coming year.
- We want to continue to identify and be made aware of caregiving opportunities and needs in our Wildwood family.

Making Disciples

Pursuing Jesus by Honing Our Habits

We continue to offer more opportunities to help our congregation grow in their walk with Jesus in three categories: classes, seminars, and resources. This past year, we had Core Classes, Bible Studies, and Sunday School Classes on a range of topics, and we pioneered Summer Book Clubs to meet throughout the week. We presented seminars on difficult topics for adults and others specifically for women. Resources to grow are growing in both size and organization through our library, Make Disciples podcast, resource table, and Wildwood Church section on RightNow Media.

Fellowship is an important part of our discipleship philosophy. Over the past year, we've hosted three Men's Breakfasts, Bunco Nights, and cookie decorating classes.

2022-2023 Highlights

- Eight Summer Book Clubs (a new initiative) met throughout Summer 2022.
- The Summer Seminar Series covered difficult topics like Creation & Evolution, God & Evil, and The Bible as God's Word.
- Our Church-Wide Bible studies on wisdom literature (Proverbs and Psalms) led to a collection of Psalms authored by the Wildwood congregation.
- Seasons 5 and 6 of the Make Disciples Podcast discussed Church History to Help, a post-Roe culture, and prayer.
- We continued to develop community with new fellowship activities for men and women.

Hopes for the Future

- We will continue to study God's Word with Bible Studies on Matthew and Revelation.
- We will begin a new cycle of Core Classes with opportunities to study Christian Story (fall) and Christian Belief (Spring).
- We will continue to develop resources with new seasons of the Make Disciples Podcast, a digitally accessible library, and suggested readings.
- We will offer opportunities for fellowship and growth tailored for men and women.

Wildwood continues to build grassroots efforts and join existing ministry partners to find creative ways to use our gifts, talents, passions, and resources to serve the Gospel inside and outside the church.

2022-2023 Highlights

- As a Church: Many of our ministries offered opportunities to serve freely, both inside and outside of the church.
- At the Local level: We hosted Family Festivals at the NCC to provide opportunities to serve and
 as outreach to our community. We launched a new ministry called Safe Families to minister
 to vulnerable children in our community. We continued to minister locally both through
 church ministries, like OFS, and para-church ministries like, CAT (Christians Against Trafficking),
 Mentors Heart, AWPC, Campus Ministries, Making Miracles Group Home, Good Samaritan
 Network, Ministry at the Capitol and more!
- Globally: This past year, we've had teams serving the Navajo Nation, England, Ukraine, Nicaragua, Costa Rica, Zambia, Panama, Guatemala and Uganda. We've heard from some of our missionaries who have visited us in person to share in our Sunday services. We continue to be engaged in Disaster Relief opportunities and our Global 6K. This year, we hosted World Vision's Chosen, where 103 children in Zambia now have sponsors right here in our faith family!

- Our hope in Serve Freely is that everyone in our faith family would embrace and live out: every member a minister by discovering their spiritual gifts and getting involved in meaningful service.
- Every ministry in our church would offer Gospel-centered opportunities to serve freely through existing and new initiatives.
- We want to see the world through the eyes of Christ and expand our partnerships and opportunities to take the Gospel to the ends of the earth.



Facilities & Operations

We want to be good stewards of our facilities.

In the last year, we updated the Sanctuary, Finance Office, and Main Street and remodeled the front restrooms.

2022-2023 Highlights

- The Sanctuary got a makeover with new carpet and paint.
- We put new carpet in Mainstreet and redid two workrooms there thanks to Katie and Caroline.
- We painted and carpeted the Finance Office.
- We renovated and redid the front restrooms.





- We hope to add new sanctuary chairs at some point.
- We want to further update our foyer and coffee areas.





The Northside Community Center has become an activity hub for our community.

The center is used by a variety of cultures in our community and is the mixing pot we hoped it would become. On Saturdays, during the school year, NCC sees over a thousand people on our recreation fields. Many of them stop by the pavilion concession stand, run by volunteers, to enjoy hamburgers and hotdogs.

2022-2023 Highlights

- Saturdays are typically full of activity as NCC has become the place for baby and bridal showers, birthday parties, gender reveal parties, graduation parties, and community banquets.
- The local pickleball community has made NCC a hub of activity every morning and many evenings, with a typical week having over 100 players.
- Two beach volleyball courts serve as the home courts for Chiles High School and training courts for Seminole High Performance Beach Volleyball.
- The center is home to Acts Academy, where they have classes five days a week during the school year.
- Red Hills Church and the Pentacosts of Capital City are two churches that meet at NCC every Sunday.
- This past year, Christ Classical Academy and Community Christian School utilized NCC for various activities and programs, including a school play and volleyball and basketball programs.

- In 2023 and 2024, NCC's campus will be expanded with additional stormwater ponds, parking, and a drive creating a loop to accommodate future expansion of Wildwood Preschool and Wildwood Church.
- Additionally, our community resources will be expanded to provide outdoor pickleball courts and a multipurpose pavilion, which will provide more service opportunities for our congregation.





From a financial viewpoint, the center has become self-supporting by covering operating expenses. In 2022, NCC's revenue was \$285,012 and operating costs were \$266,588.

In the first half of 2023, NCC is already running a surplus of over \$29,000 and on track to transfer back \$40,000+ back to Wildwood Church by December 2023.

Thank you for your continued faithful giving to the ministries of Wildwood Church!



Year in Review

Total giving to Wildwood in 2022/2023 was \$2,695,102: General Fund giving totaled \$2,344,111, and designated giving was \$350,991. The graphics below compares financial giving over the past two fiscal years.



Wildwood had 540 donors during the 2021/2022 fiscal year. The average annual contribution by donor family was \$4,692.



Wildwood had 553 donors during the 2022/2023 fiscal year. The average annual contribution by donor family was \$4,198.
